



Admissions policy

Statement of intent

It is our intention to make our setting accessible to children and families from all sections of our local diverse community.

Aim

We aim to ensure that all sections of our community have access to the setting through open, fair and clearly communicated procedures.

Methods

In order to achieve this aim, we operate the following admissions policy.

- We ensure that our setting is advertised in our diverse community.
- Information can be provided in large print, Braille, through signing, an interpreter or translated into another language.
- We can offer an emergency place at Kidz Star Club.
- We arrange our waiting list in order of first come first served basis, taking into account sibling already attending the setting or previous club registrations.
- We welcome all parents, carers, relatives, play workers and professionals.
- We do not discriminate against a child or their family or prevent entry to our setting on the basis of colour, ethnicity, and religion, social background such as being a member of a travelling community or an asylum seeker.
- We ensure our equality and diversity policy is adhered to.
- We consult with families about the opening times of the setting to ensure we meet the needs of our clientele.
- We co-operate with other clubs run at Landscore and will take or collect children from them.
- Parents must give four weeks notice before they leave Kidz Star Club, if the child leaves before the parent will be invoiced for the four weeks notice.

In accordance to **Article 28 Education** (UNCRC 1989)

The child has the right to education; the State has a duty to make primary education compulsory and free to all and to take measures to develop different forms of secondary education and to make this accessible to all children. School discipline should be administered in a manner consistent with the child's human dignity. States that ratify the Convention have an obligation to encourage international co-operation to ensure the implementation of the child's right to education, taking particular account of the needs of developing countries.
